Diane Rene' (Quinlan) Rainey passed away the morning of January 20th after a long battle with heart, liver and kidney failure likely resulting from a longer battle with rheumatoid arthritis at St. Vincent hospital in Billings, MT. Her family was by her side the entire time cheering on her recovery.

Diane was born in Glendive on June 4, 1961 to Irene Herauf and James Quinlan. She was the oldest daughter of 5 siblings. Diane's childhood consisted of growing up in Miles City and graduating from Rosebud High in 1979.

Through the years Diane held many jobs including working at the Crystal Pistol, Pizza Hut, NZ Shoes and Super America where she would work with her future sister-in-law Mickey, who introduced Diane to her brother, "the most handsome guy she had seen" Diane's future husband, Robert.
