From folks he meets way down there.

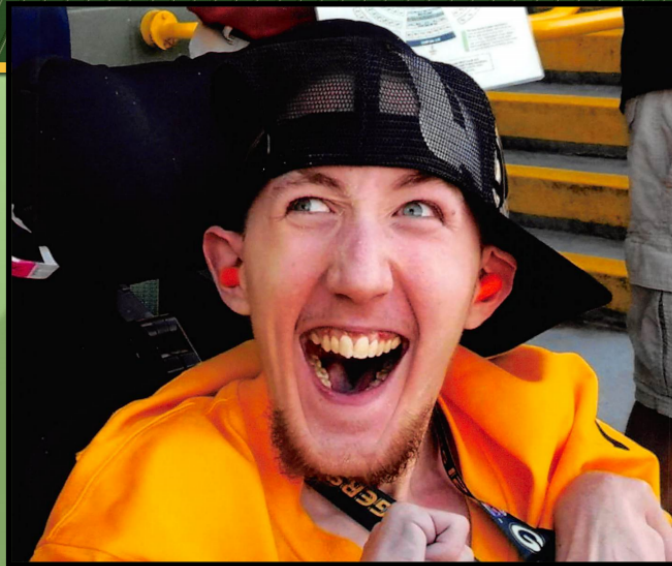
He may not run or laugh or play

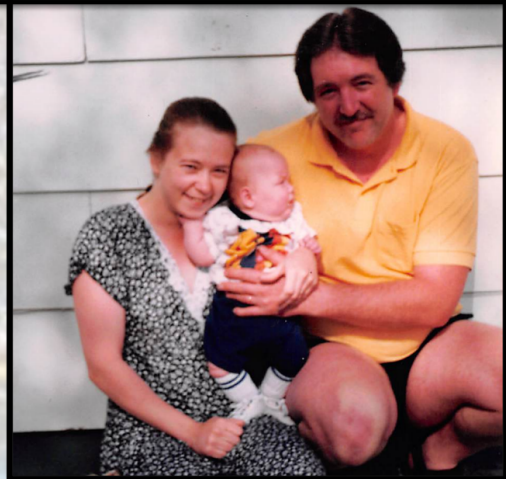


In Loving Memory Of
