

She then graduated from Life Bible College in Los Angeles, California in 1969 with a Bachelor's degree in Religious Education.

While at Bible College, Sheryl met the love of her life, Harvey Tedder. Their first date was a hayride that Sheryl invited Harvey to attend. They dated for a short time until Sheryl graduated and returned to Miles City. Upon her return, she taught Kindergarten class and teacher training classes at Foursquare Church.
